With just a two-hour charge of sunshine the LightCap will stay bright for hours and the internal rechargeable Ni-Cad system will last at least 300 cycles. The bulbs are guaranteed for 10,000 hours and the solar charging system is totally sealed: no batteries to replace, no bulbs to burn out. The watertight switch activates between the bright white bulb (bright enough for reading) or red (preserves your night vision), or you can switch it off altogether to conserve power. There's even a light sensor on top that turns the light off in the day if you accidentally leave it on.

The narrow-waisted bottle makes it easy to grip with cold, wet, greasy or small hands and you can lay it on its side and it won't roll off the table. You can even aim the bottom of the bottle outward and use it as a flashlight. The wide mouth makes it easy to fill, mix things in, clean AND dry: no more suspect growth in your drinking water!

With a LightCap you won't have to worry about running down your boat battery, or dead or corroded flashlight batteries. Charge it from inside or outside during the day and have a convenient, windproof light for eating, reading or just hanging out; no more noisy, dangerous, smelly gas lanterns or candles constantly blowing out.
